Open Letter to All TTCM Members

Reply to Open Letter from Don Westphal, Pres; Tom Westerhouse, Past Pres; and Dick Hamlin, Past President

Dear Sir or Madam:

The purpose of this letter is to notify all TTCM members that the remarks made by these three current and past leaders of our organization wrote this letter for all members of TTCM, without verifying nor contacting me to either verify the truth in these comments, instead of what they really are: lies and omissions. I would expect much better from current and past presidents of TTCM. I am so disappointed in the three of you. I guess writing this editorial was a scare-off attempt rather than finding the truth and printing it.

To begin with:

1. The comments about smoking outside and the smoke traveling into the hall, failed to mention that while my group was having dinner, these smoking folks were sitting just outside the garage door, with the door open.
