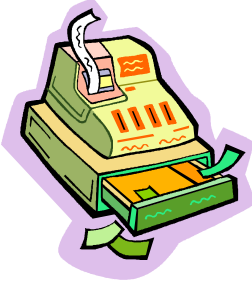

Editor's Note: *Although Bellevue will have a Garage Sale, Jerry Settler asked me to pass along that HESPERIA will NOT have a Garage Sale this year.*

TTCM Flashback

April 9, 1964: A meeting was held at Karl Werner's Trailer Sales with 36 people in attendance to form a chapter in TTCM, known as the Oakland Lakes Travel Club, headed by president John Gab.

April 18, 1964: A group of Trailerites meet at White Cloud State Park to form a chapter in TTCM. Mr. Slink was voted as the president. It was decided to have 100 trailers in the chapter and it shall be known as the Grand Valley Travelers.

April 1965: \$1.00 assessed per member towards purchase of land with a pit toilet & water pump.

In 1966, dues were raised from \$2.00 a year to \$4.00 a year with \$1.50 of the dues going into the land fund. \$1,473.00 was collected through members and a loan. \$453.00 was paid on the Gladwin property with \$20.00 paid to lease the UP Strong's Corners. \$473.00 was paid out with a balance of \$1,000.00 in land fund. \$590.00 was to be paid on the Gladwin property, December 16, 1966.

April 1, 1967: Ray Marshall was voted as Treasurer and Mildred Berkimer was voted to sit on the Board of Directors.

June 7, 1967: A motion was made by Dean Weis, seconded by Ray Marshall, that from this day forth all outgoing TTCM Presidents be given a lifetime membership in TTCM.
