REMEMBER WHEN????

Spring 1974: \$1.00 donation per night from the camping at Hesperia was put into effect. This will help defray the cost of electricity, garbage pickup and taxes. Balance due on Hesperia is \$4,343.62. The assessment on the land has been raised from \$3,000 to \$8,000.

August 1974: 17 chapters attended the officers meeting. We need to look for land on the east side of state.

May 1975: President Carl Anderson has found 15.5 acres about 7.5 miles from the Indiana line for \$12,900. It's 2.5 miles west of I-69.

January 1976: A trailer for \$650 was purchased to house all Rally supplies. The All American will be held at the Elkhart County 4-H Fairgrounds. Representatives from Indiana and Ohio chose what programs to do at the rally.


April 1976: Board meeting was held in Indiana. Beverly Parshall was elected secretary to replace Kay Robe who will resign as of the Labor Day Rally. There are 742 paid members, 21 associate members, and 77 members at large. Last year, 145 members dropped their membership. Over 300 names were acquired from the Detroit Trailer Show.

May 1976: Executive Council meeting was held. Balance in treasury was \$3,270.36. Ray Owens reported on prices for a shelter house at Hesperia. The cost was between \$2,666 and \$3,500 depending on size. The cost of the building would be paid for by Blue Water Rovers, Grand Valley Travelers, Happy Wanders, and Restless Ones.

December 1976: Meeting was held at the Sveden House in Jackson. Treasurer reported there was \$1,406.82 in the general fund and the special land fund has \$1,596.38.

May 1977: TTCM has 25 chapters. They are as follows: Capitol City Campers, Blue Water Rovers, Blossomland Travelers, Cross Roads, Council Oaks, Happy Campers, Happy Wanders, Grand Valley, Restless Ones, Michianna Wheelers, Happy Hitchers, Golden Agers, Limber Lost Wheelers, River Raisin, Onago, Go-4-Fun, Vactionland Travelers, Wolverines, Trailblazers, Pleasure Seekers, Rollin Wheels, Draggin Train, and MALs. Jim English was elected President of TTCM.

Secretary's comments: We didn't have much money, struggling to develop ONE campground, but we had a lot of Chapters at this time. But, still we struggled as a family with one common goal, TTCM. Because of these Chapters and those members planting the seeds, we have what we have today. Stop!!! Pause!!! and Reflect!!!
